The Department for Education Vision for the Primary PE and Sport Premium is:

ALL pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

Key Information:

The government provides this additional funding to improve provision of physical education (PE), sport and physical activity in primary schools. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision for PE and sport in schools.

The funding has been provided with the expectation that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 indicators:

- 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy, active lifestyles**
- 2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement**
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport**
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils**
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport**

Sport Premium Whole School Focus 2020-2021:

This year we are allocating money to increase the profile of all forms of physical activity in school. We will reinvigorate our provision and resources, increase competition (where we can safely) engage with more diverse activities and get our children to more fully use the amazing local area!
