What is Bullying?

Bullying is hurtful or unkind behaviour which is deliberate and over a period of time. Bullying is when someone is being hurt by one person or a group of people.

The **STOP** acronym defines bullying:









Types of Bullying:

(Remember: Several Times On Purpose)

- ⇒ **Physical:** hitting, kicking, shoving or physically hurting you.
- ⇒ **Verbal:** name calling, using offensive language, threatening, spreading rumours or hurting your feelings with words.
- ⇒ **Emotional:** ignoring or making you feel lonely.
- ⇒ **Cyber:** using the internet, a tablet or mobile phone to write or say hurtful things to you.
- ⇒ Attacking your things: damaging, stealing or hiding your belongings.

How to get help if you are being bullied:

Speak to:





A member of staff



A friend, who will help you to get help from an adult.



A trusted adult



Or you can report your worries into your classroom Worry Box or Worry Monster.

What we do in school to prevent and stop bullying:

- ♦ All school staff have a duty to look after us and keep us safe.
- ♦ Bullying is not acceptable and will not be tolerated; whether it is in school or happening outside of school.
- ♦ We will take your bullying concerns seriously and help you.
- ♦ We have an Anti-Bullying leader: Mrs Walsh.
- ♦ We take part in Anti-Bullying Week and have assemblies on Anti-Bullying.
- We are all aware of our Anti-Bullying Policy; with child-friendly posters around school and leaflets in our classrooms, which have been created by our School Council. These give us extra information about what to do if we feel we are being bullied.
- ◆ Our school values of Ambition, Respect and Collaboration feed through everything in our school.
- We celebrate our differences, our similarities and our uniqueness:

- ◆ **DO NOT** take part in any kind of bullying.
- ♦ Raise concerns to a member of staff in school
- Look out for signs of bullying: if you or someone you know is being bullied, speak to a member of staff, a trusted adult, a friend (who will help you to get help from an adult) or put your concern in your class Worry Box.
- ◆ Be supportive of everyone in school and outside of school; always be kind and treat others how you would want to be treated.
